The third annual session of the NORTHEAST INSTI-TUTE OF ALCOHOL STUDIES, co-sponsored by the official State Alcoholism Programs of nine Northeastern States, will be held on the campus of Rutgers - The State University, New Brunswick, New Jersey, June 19 to 24. 1966.

The Institute provides a general overview of problems of alcohol and alcoholism for board members of official and voluntary agencies, civic leaders, and others without special training or experience in this field; and for persons with professional qualifications who have little acquaintance with the field, or who are unable to devote more than a week to such study.
